### In Memoriam

It is with great sadness that the SSJR reports the death of Society member Minor Rogers. Rogers, who received his doctorate in 1972 from Harvard University, died of cancer on August 25, 1991. He was duPont Professor of Religion at Washington and Lee University. A specialist in Japanese Pure Land Buddhism, Rogers did extensive research on the Honganji branch of the Jødo Shinshæ. Most recently, he collaborated with his wife, Ann Rogers, on a book about the pivotal fifteenth century Jødo Shinshæ priest, Rennyo.
